Share A Share bags will have 4-5 different vegetables in them each week, which changes throughout the season. For example, a spring bag might have carrots, lettuce, snow peas and radishes, a summer bag might have potatoes, tomatoes, onions and bell peppers, and a fall box might have butternut squash, beets, watermelon and sweet potatoes. The CSA will begin on May 24 and go for 22 weeks (there will be a week off in June and August), through October 21.
